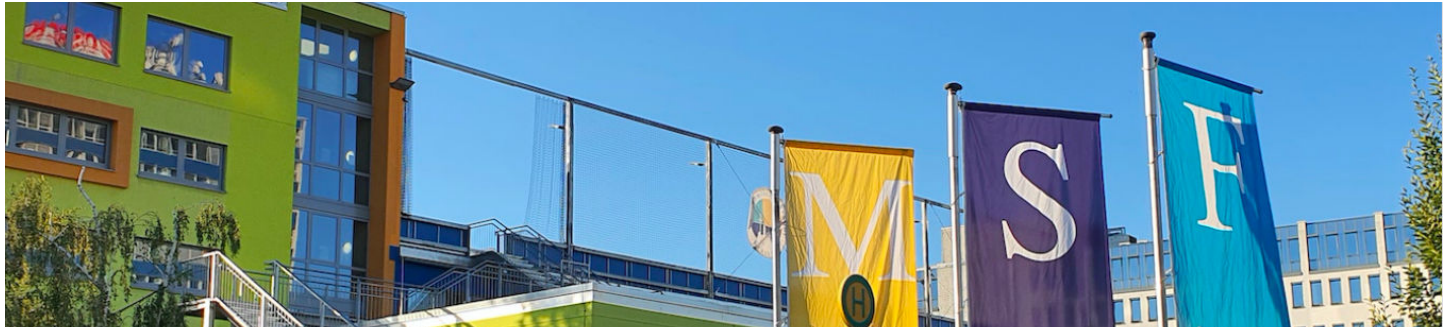

The students have recently received their Semester One reports. In a few weeks time, we also have the Student Led Conferences for grades 1,2 & 3 and the Student, Parent, Teacher Conferences for grades 4 & 5. These are also wonderful opportunities for the student to reflect on and explain their learning, please do attend if possible.

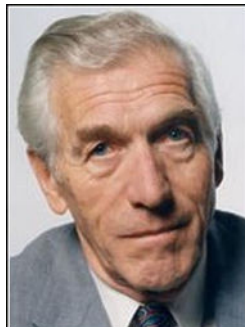
