New MSF Theatre Building Update

A big thank you to all parents, students, teachers and staff for your patience and support during the foundation works for our exciting new theatre over the past few weeks. We are making excellent progress and will soon see the installation of the distinctive V-shaped steel pillars that will support the entire structure. It is always inspiring to watch a vision gradually take shape. The building will feature an elegant reception area with a balcony overlooking the school parking area, a large stage, professional lighting and sound systems, and seating for up to 700 spectators. It will be the largest theatre in the region, providing an outstanding space for performances, assemblies, concerts, graduations, and community events for many years to come. We remain on schedule for completion after the summer break in 2027, just in time for our school's 20th anniversary celebrations.

Message from the Principal - Mr Wragg

I am very fortunate this week to be with Grade 5 on their residential trip. We are spending a week in Edersee, a beautiful area of forests, meadows and lakes, two hours north of Frankfurt. This week Grade 3 is also out in nature, in Büdingen, and Grade 4 is in Koblenz. On each of the camps there is a mixture of organised activities and both unstructured and structured 'free' time. The experiences of being away from home, sharing a room with peers and having to manage clothing and washing independently are both challenging and empowering. Through these experiences, our students come back with a little more confidence and resilience, safe in the knowledge that they can survive and even flourish, during a couple of nights away from the support of their parents. Having now attended all our Grade's camps over the last 4 years, I am certain of their immense value. As a parent, I feel the pressure, that I am sure many of you feel, to keep my kids busy and 'entertained' when they are at home. However, it is in the downtime, or 'unstructured' time during these camps when I observe the students at their happiest: chatting, making up games, starting a table tennis match, sitting together and drawing, playing hide and seek or just laying back and looking at the clouds. As there are less distractions on these camps, the students often have to create their own fun and they do so, with huge success. It is a little reminder that just letting kids play together, without micro-management, is well worth it and something we can and should all make time for.

Other Information

Information from the nurse

We can all help prevent the spread of infectious diseases through early recognition and action. Sick students put staff and peers at risk, especially those who are immuno-compromised or pregnant. Parents are responsible for keeping sick children at home and reporting infectious cases to the school office. Students suspected of having an infectious disease must be seen by a doctor for proper diagnosis. A list of common notifiable diseases and further information can be found [here](#).

Do not send your child to school if they have any of the following symptoms:

- **Temperature above 38°C**
- **Acute cold, sore throat or persistent cough**
- **Vomiting, nausea or severe abdominal pain**
- **Diarrhoea**
- **Red inflamed or discharging eyes**
- **Suspected and untreated head lice**
- **Acute skin rashes or eruptions**
- **Other symptoms of acute illness/unfit for school due to lethargy & tiredness**

Please remember, your child should be symptom free for 24 hours before returning to school after illness. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Important Information for all drivers

1. Parking in the MSF Car Park – Reserved Teacher Parking

Parents must not park in any signposted teacher parking spaces. These spaces are privately rented, and our staff rely on them being available for work. Cars parked in these reserved spaces will be clamped, as locating the owner causes delays for teachers and disrupts classes. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping the car park safe and ensuring smooth daily operations for everyone.

2. Eschborner Landstrasse

Please do not stop in the middle of the road to let your child out on Eschborner Landstrasse - please pull into the stop and drop zone, into a parking space or make use of the MSF parking lot. Stopping in the middle of the street is dangerous and disrupts the traffic flow in the mornings. Such traffic violations may also result in a fine from the Ordnungsamt. Thank you for helping keep all our community safe in the mornings.

3. Drop-Off and Pick-Up

Please never stop or park on the private property of **SEGRO Park Frankfurt City, Gaugrafenstraße 20–24**. Parking on this private property causes obstructions, damage, and increased accident risks. For the safety of all children and respectful coexistence, please avoid these areas. Thank you for your cooperation.
